And Yet Another Fire!

While working on this weeks edition of The Paper, I started getting calls and radio traffic about a fire at Stoneyvale Rd. and Big Tujunga Canyon Rd. It was originally reported as possibly from the construction crew at Vogel Flats, but we'll never really know. One photo shows cars and people standing next to the fire that was coming over mountain towards the ANF fire camp. It ended up being a 9 acre fire.

There initially were ANF firefighters from Lake View Terrace, LAFD engine companies, CAL FIRE and CHP and Sheriffs. There were no injuries and the fire was contained within 3 hours. Then 2 days later another fire started in the Vogel Flats area and everybody rolled again with the addition of a FOX FIELD Helitack team H532 on scene.

This fire was reported at 3:34pm

The LAFD was on scene as an assisting agency to Angeles National Forest with (from ANF size up) approximately 1/2 acre in medium to heavy brush. LAFD ground companies 74 & 24 were assigned to structural triage in the Vogel Flats area. We do not have evacuation information and all public/media queries are directed to ANF as the incident command. For their up-

dates, follow on Twitter. As I was moving through the heavy sage plants, I stumbled across the remains of the Vogel Flats community that was destroyed in the Station fire.



Arnie's Bakery on The Boulevard!

Our local oligarch Arnie Abrahamian has taken on his largest project so far. Leasing the old Bonners Equipment Rental property at 6935 E. Foothill Blvd. from Owner Tim Morelli, this property that is zoned for a planned development for multi-family dwellings had an asking price of \$6M.

With a combined approximate size of 40,246 (32,590 square feet of LAC2 and 7,656 square feet of LARD3) square feet from seven parcels, the lot has a slight slope and rests North of the 210 Freeway. The existing buildings consist of a main retail building





along with two rear garage/storage structures.

With a zoning of LAC2 and LARD3, a builder will have the by-right allowance to build a total of 81 apartment units. With the usage of the California State density bonus program, a builder will have the opportunity to build 114 units (Buyer to Verify). Along with the increase in unit allowance, a

builder will be allowed other "on-menu" incentives that may be confirmed with the City of Los Angeles. There were multiple tenants paying gross monthly rents of approximately \$17,800. Yet, only Arnie had the vision to create a bakery-café and possible night club.

It finally looks like a win-win situation for Sunland-Tujunga. ■





How Do We Apply for My Wife's Spousal Benefit?

Dear Rusty: I am 78, still work
Dear Rusty: I am 70 years old and just started receiving my Social Security benefits about 4 months ago and I get close to \$3700 per month. My wife is 65 years old and worked sporadically over the years so is entitled to her own benefits. If we applied under her account, she would get around \$300 a month. If she applies under the spousal benefits, she should get a lot more, but we are not exactly sure how to apply for spousal benefits under her existing account. Can you help guide us? **Signed: Uncertain How to Proceed**

Dear Uncertain: Your wife can apply for both her own SS retirement benefit (from her own lifetime work record) and her spousal benefit from you, at the same time. In fact, when she applies for her own Social Security benefit, since

you are now collecting your benefits she will be automatically deemed to be filing also for her spousal benefit from you. Your wife's Social Security payment will actually consist of two elements - her own earned benefit and a "spousal boost" to bring her to her spousal entitlement. So, when she applies for her own SS benefit, she will also get a spousal boost to make her payment equal to what she is entitled to as your spouse. She can apply by calling Social Security at your local office or calling the national service center at 1.800.772.1213 to request an appointment. She also has the option to apply for her benefits online at www.ssa.gov which is, by far, the most efficient way. To apply online, your wife will need to first create her personal "my Social Security" online account, which is easy to do at www.ssa.gov/myaccount. When your wife fills

out the application for her benefits, she will be able to identify you as her spouse, and she should use the "Remarks" section of the application to emphasize that she wishes to receive her spousal benefits as well. Just for your awareness, your wife's spousal benefit will be based on your full retirement age (FRA) benefit amount, not your age 70 amount, and if she claims at age 65 her benefits will be reduced because she hasn't yet reached her own full retirement age (which is 66 years and 4 months if she was born in 1956). Your wife's personal benefit will be reduced by .556% for each month earlier than her FRA that she claims, and her spousal boost will be reduced by .694% for each month earlier than her FRA she claims. So, if your wife claims her benefit before her full retirement age, her payment will be less than 50% of your FRA benefit amount.■




